There is a worry that recently came to light when one single woman went away for supposedly only a few weeks, and when she didn't return as expected, Board members were alerted and found they were helpless to track her down.

The Post Office had officially listed her home as "vacant," phone numbers left with a neighbor were disconnected, and the Sheriff's office couldn't help because only a family member can file a missing person's report. Her yard became overgrown against the deed restrictions, and the HOA began mowing and billing for services to keep your yard maintained.

Finally, after nearly three months, the neighbor returned to learn about neighbors' concerns. IF YOU LIVE ALONE, PLEASE MAKE SURE A TRUSTED NEIGHBOR KNOWS YOUR WHEREABOUTS, LEAVE FAMILY NAMES AND NUMBERS FOR EMERGENCY CONTACT !!!!!

Watering Restrictions

Mandatory one-day per week lawn watering restrictions beginning November 1, 2009 and return to two days a week on March 14, 2010.

- > Saturday at addresses that end in an odd number
- > Sunday at addresses that end in an even number
- ➤ No irrigation allowed between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- ➤ Limited to 3/4 inch of water per irrigation zone
- ➤ No more than one hour per irrigation zone
- Applies to water withdrawn from ground or surface water, from a private well or pump, or from a public or private water utility
