Seminole County garbage pickup schedule has changed. Up until this year, the only legal holidays there was no

pickup was Thanksgiving and Christmas. But now, ANY legal holiday that falls on Monday, Wednesday or Thursday will be observed, and there will be no pickup until the NEXT regular day.

WELCOME NEW HOMEOWNERS AND **RENTORS!!**

Hopefully you received a copy of our Deed Restrictions when you rented your home or completed the closing on your property here in *The* Terrace.

Since 1984, when our 163 homes were completed, as part of The Deer Run Community, each HOA has a volunteer Board to enforce the deed restrictions; collect yearly dues and help neighbors maintain their properties in keeping with the restrictions.

- Yards and gardens are to be kept mowed, edged and
- No trailers or boats are to be stored in view of the road, past three days
- Garbage cans are to be stored out of sight and removed after pick-up
- Exterior paint changes or additions need HOA approval
- No businesses run out of our one-family residences
